POINTS TROPHIES at ASA Championships

BRIDSON CUP: Club open events points 5.3.1. for medallist .

Contested for 61 years

Won - NSS 15, Wai 14, LME 10, Ros 9, ONE 5, MTW 3, New 2, PAR 2, WAQ 1

Donated in 1946 by Mrs W M Bridson, Life member, Team official, chaperone to 1950 Games team, NSS patron many yrs, taught many to swim



AUNTY JOHNSON CUP: Club 16/u age groups points 5.3.1. for medalists

Contested for 68 years, twice had joint winners

Won- NSS 17, PAR 14, ONE 9, WAI 8, ROS 6, NEW 5, LME 4, MTW 3,
WAQ 2, NEW 1, Eastern Suburbs 1.

Donor – Parnell Club, Mrs Johnson was known as “Aunty” the name given to team chaperones pre 1950



LOU RICHARDSON CUP; Men’s points open events 5.3.1. medalists

Contested for 55 years

Most wins - Michael Davidson 6, Trent Bray 5.

Donor – Waitemata Club. Lou Richardson was a stalwart of the Waitemata club in its hey-day. ASA Selector, Life member, great fund raiser.



TED HARDING CUP: Women’s points open events 5.3.1 medallists

Contested for 44 years

Most wins – Monique Rodahl 5, Beth Williams 4

Donor: Onehunga Club. Ted Harding was ASA and NZ Life Member, NZ selector, ASA Chairman, handicapper, official



PREMIER CLUB RELAY BANNER Club points 5.3.1 at Relay championships

Contested 47 years joint winners one year

Won – NSS 23, PAR 12, LME 6, ROS 3, ONE 2, MTW 2.

Donor - Rex Moore. NZ and ASA life member, NZ selector and President, Chairman of 1950 Games organizing committee. Original embroidered banner was lost when Newmarket Pool was covered



HALLYBURTON JOHNSON SHIELD Overall club points opens, age groups, juniors, relays, open water championships – visitors included.

Points: open events 18, 16, 15, 14, 13,12,11,10 for finalists

Age group events 9, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 for finalists

Contested for 61 years, conditions have varied.

Won – NSS 18, WAI 11, ROS 11, PAR 6, LME 5, ES 3, MTW 3,
NEW 2, LME 1, OTU 1.



NEW CALEDONIAN TROPHY: Best performance by visitor, selectors to name

Contested 23 years

Most wins: Alison Fitch 3, Kane Radford 2.

Donor: New Caledonian Swimming Association.



**CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS TROPHY –Top performance at Championships
Based on world rankings or similar.**

Contested 23 years

Most wins – Trent Bray 4, Dean Kent 3, N. Sanders 2, C. Gibson 2, E. Coster 2.

Donor: Norma Williams ASA and NZ life member, NZ selector, chaperone 1968
Olympic Games, life member NSS and ONE clubs



DALTON TROPHIES for versatility and excellence age group events 15/ under

“Finalists “ for the trophy for each grade, most medallist points (versatility)

Winners are those closest to an ASA records for their grade.(excellence)

Contested 39 years

Most wins BOYS: Nicholas Sanders 5, Joshua Agnew 4



GIRLS Caroline Baddock 3, Danielle Koni 3

Donor: Bill Dalton ASA Patron 10yrs, President 16yrs, ASA Life Member
Chairman of Eastern Suburbs Club.



**VICE –PRESIDENTS TROPHY; girls 100, 200, 400m free – 12y, 13y, 14y 15yrs
Points 12; 10; 8; 6; 4; 2 finalists. If tied – closest to equivalent NZ record**

Contested 24 years

Most wins – Carmen Ooi 3, A Pinny 2, V Wells 2, C Collard 2, E Hotchin 2.

Donor- Dan Bennett ASA vice president for three years, also a coach.



**BATTY CUP Dual relay. Finalists in m/ w 50m freestyle draw for partners.
Old dual relay trophy re-introduced in 1986 Visitors included.**



**SHANAHAN PLAQUES - Ten ASA open titles. Can be claimed only once
Originally called Auckland Plaques – name changed 2005
to honour Mick Shamahan – ASA Life Member, and Patron.**

First awarded 1976.

Winners to 2008 - 26 swimmers (Noted- must be titleholder, not 2nd to a visitor)



TED HARDING SWIMMER OF THE YEAR TROPHY.

Re Ted Harding – refer Ted Harding Cup above.

Contested since 1976

Most wins – Dean Kent 4, Moss Burmester 3, Trent Bray 3,
John Steel 3, Anthony Mosse 3



EVA TILSLEY TROPHY – from 1999 best 18yrs and under swimmer

Contested since 1988

Most wins – Trent Bray 4, John Munro 2, Melissa Ingram 2, Corney Swanepoel 2,
Lauren Boyle 2,

Donor: Eva Tilsley ASA Life Member, popular team official 20 years 1940 -1960



TITLEHOLDERS' TROPHIES

PARNELL JUBILEE CUP - Men's 100m freestyle

Contested since 1966 – Parnell Club's 50th year anniversary

Most Wins - Trent Bray 8, Glen Smith 6.



NEWMARKET CUP women's 100m freestyle

Contested since 1969

Most Wins – Alison Fitch 6, Monique Rodahl 5



PRESIDENT'S CUP - youngest grade girl's 100m freestyle

Contested since 1969

Most wins – Bronwyn Smith 2, Amanda McLean 2, Loran Catley 2



AUCKLAND CENTENNIAL CUP (1) - Men's 100m backstroke

Contested since 1972

Most wins – Neville Wiig 4, Scott Talbot Cameron 3, Kirk Torrance 3,



PONDER SHIELD – women's 100m backstroke

In memory of young swimmer Jean Ponder who died at the Parnell Baths

Contested since 1957

Most wins –Margaret Macrae 7, Hannah McLean 7, Monique Rodahl 5.



MERV RAYMOND MEMORIAL TROPHY – men's 200m backstroke

Contested since 1999

Presented by Raymond family – Merv was ASA Life Member.

Most wins – Cameron Gibson 3,



**BRIAN PIKE MEMORIAL CUP – Boy's 15/u backstroke, fastest finalist in
Open 200m event. If no 15/u finalists, then fastest 15/u 200m backstroke**

Contested since 1964

Brian was killed in a quarry rock fall shortly after winning NZ junior championship

Most wins - Peter Ayson 3, Dean Coote 3,



AUCKLAND CENTENNIAL CUP (2) Women's 100m breaststroke

Contested since 1972

Most wins – Sarah Mahon 6, Monique Rodahl 3, Danielle Bates 3, Emma Blake 3.



LOCKHART CUP - fastest 100m breaststroke – Boy’s 15/under grades.

Contested since 1992

Most wins – Steven Ferguson 3, Amini Fonua 2,

Donor : Lockhart family. Richard was an Olympian



MT EDEN CUP – men’s 200m breaststroke

Contested since 1983

Most wins – Dean Kent 9



MORRIS CUP – women’s 200m breaststroke

Contested since 1982

Most wins – Sarah Mahon 6, Danielle Bates 3, Belinda Harper 3, Emma Blake 3,

Donor: Morris Family – Sarah was a promising breaststroker, but shifted to Australia



LAWRIE REED MEMORIAL TROPHY – girl’s 13-14yrs 200 m breaststroke

Fastest time if swum in single age grades.

Contested since 1990

Most wins – Alice Lee 2, Carissa Thompson 2, Chloe Francis 2.

Donated anonymously – honours Lawrie Reed - ASA chairman 9 yrs, President 3yrs
ASA Life Member, NZ official, died as a result of a car accident



AQUA SHOP CUP – mens 100m butterfly

Contested since 2004

Donor Chris Lazaridis – owner of Aqua Shop.



ROSS ANDERSON MEMORIAL TROPHY - men’s 400m medley

Contested since 1998

Wins – Dean Kent 9 , the only winner to 2008.

Donated to honour Ross Anderson – prominent coach



WAITAKERE LICENSING TRUST Trophy

Best performance at ASA Winter Championships

Selection panel – 2 ASA coaches and 1 selector, and 1 visiting coach.

Contested since 1993 Most wins – Melissa Ingram 3.



OPEN WATER TROPHIES

HAROLD PETIT CUP – Most points in open water swims.

On handicap – 1st - 5pts, 2nd – 3 pts, 3rd – 2pts, all others who finish 1pt.

Fastest time - an extra point.

Contested since 1938

Donor – Dr. Harold Pettit who was an open water swimmer himself. And an ASA and NZ Life Member



D. McL. WALLACE CUP

Winner of the handicap section of ASA 5km Open water championship.

Handicapping based on 5km swims or current 1500m time.

Contested since 1946

Donor – Newmarket firm – D McL Wallace - Agricultural Engineering .

Most wins - Owen Elwarth 2, Kate Brookes Peterson 2, Jeremy Gray 2,



Trophies not currently contested – to be re-allocated.

Bruce Whineray Cup and Arty Shaw Trophy -- zone and league championships
